4. They should accept whatever work is assigned to them as their rightful share.
5. They should face difficulties courageously.
6. They should always be ready to lend a helping hand to their parents, brothers, sisters, teachers, companions and even to any unattended visitor they happen to meet in the school campus.
7. They should never cheat or use unfair means in studies and games.

9. They should always be honest and truthful.

11. They should respect the beauty of the classrooms and the school premises and report any damage they may observe.

Note for Parents/ Guardians

- Kindly check the haircut, uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning.
- Please see that your ward carries text / exercise books according to the Time Table of the day. No extra books are allowed.
- Kindly ensure that he/she is prepared for the Monday/Wednesday tests. Also see his/her Report Card and teacher's remarks in his/her class work / homework exercise books and school almanac.
- Kindly inform the school if there is any change in the address or telephone numbers.
- Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- Restrict daily pocket money to Rs. 20/- per day. Excessive spending should be discouraged.
- Children should not bring crackers, colours, transistors, cameras, video cameras, calculators, mobile phone etc to the school. Bursting of crackers and playing with colours is liable to expulsion of a student from the school.
- Your ward should be instructed to be careful about his/her possessions. There should be a name tag on the articles. Expensive articles should not be brought to school. The students are also not allowed to wear jewellery in the school. In case of violation of this rule, the articles will be confiscated. The school bears no responsibility for the articles lost in the school. In case of loss, a letter giving details of the lost item may be sent to the class teacher.

Nursery School Programme

The Nursery School programme is designed to encourage a balance of child centred and teacher facilitated activities. This programme offers children a variety of choices provided within a carefully prepared indoor and outdoor environment. The environment includes art, dramatic plays, unit blocks, manipulatives, language arts, books, music, computers, water and sand play, building of large structures, gardening, running, climbing, animal care, and a variety of large and small motor activities. Our goal is to encourage each child's natural curiosity and interests in learning. We feel it is important for the children to actively participate in the learning process, and therefore provide many opportunities for learning by doing, for both indirect and direct acquisition of new knowledge and skill. The school's curriculum covers the following six areas of learning:

- Number Skill
- Communication and language
- Personal, social and emotional aspect
- Knowledge and understanding of the world
- Physical awareness
- Creative and aesthetic areas

For the Parents of our Nursery School

- 1.** The child must always wear a badge giving information about his / her name, class, address, telephone number and the bus stop.
- 2.** Please find out the bus number, the exact bus stop, the morning and afternoon timings of the bus from the Transport Department.
- 3.** No child will be picked up from the bus stop unless he / she is wearing a badge. There must be someone to receive the child at the bus stop in the afternoon.
- 4.** Children using the bus must not be accompanied by either parent for more than two days. Please help the child to settle down comfortably at the earliest.
- 5.** Please try to send the same person every day for those children who will be picked up by a servant or driver. They should reach school ten minutes before the bell.
- 6.** Please do not take your child back from school during teaching hours. If you have some plan for the day, kindly do not send the child to school on that day.
- 7.** The bag, napkin, water bottle etc. carried by the child, should have his / her name, class and section written on it. This is a must to avoid any loss.
- 8.** A handkerchief should be pinned to the child's uniform everyday.
- 9.** Distribution of very few sweets is allowed on birthdays in the class.
- 10.** Whenever a teacher sends you a note, kindly reply back and do the needful. Please do not mind if she is unable to reply to every letter. Please bear in mind that whatever the teacher does it is for the child's benefit. If you have queries or complaints, it is the best to talk to the Parent Representative.
- 11.** Your child should be regular in the class, as frequent absence hampers the progress of the child. Please ensure that the child goes to the toilet before coming to school.
- 12.** The newsletters and assignments of different subjects are sent periodically. These should be preserved in folders for future reference. Parents are requested to go through these assignments along with their child for the reinforcement of concepts introduced in the class.
- 13.** Please encourage your child to eat healthy and wholesome food. We as teachers also guide the children to eat the right kind of meals and for that purpose have made a menu plan for the week. Please ensure that the child's tiffin contains food as per the menu plan.
- 14.** Parent – Teacher Meetings are held for parents to interact with their ward's class teacher. Please ensure your presence. Prior information will be sent to you regarding the date and time.
- 15.** Please make sure that your child goes to bed early so that he / she is fresh and happy, the next morning and is not forced to getting ready for school.
- 16.** Please ensure that your child is not exposed to the films which are not meant for his / her age group, especially those with the violence as they have an adverse effect on the child.
- 17.** It would go a long way if parents could spend quality time with their child like reading out story books whenever possible.
- 18.** Please do not try to meet your ward's class teacher in the class during school hours. However, you may see any teacher taking prior appointment.
- 19.** A sick child should not be sent to school. In case of an emergency, if the school doctor instructs, the parents will be requested to take the child back.
- 20.** In case a child is absent for more than two days, due to any illness, a leave application must be sent to the teacher. In case of any other reason of absence, prior sanction should to be sought.
- 21.** Kindly inform the school, at the earliest in case of any change in the address or telephone numbers.

School Rules

1. Every student must carry his/her **almanac** and **identity card** to school every day.
2. **A student should affix his/her photograph and write the required information, duly signed by parents, in the space provided for in the almanac.**
3. The students, who come to school on their own, should reach at the school before the bell rings.
4. The students are not allowed to bring their mobile phones to the school. If they do so, the phones will be confiscated.
5. The morning bell is a signal for all to go to the assembly or to their respective classrooms. This should be done promptly and silently.
6. Change of classrooms between periods should be done in an orderly manner and silently.
7. The students should be habitually clean and neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all the working days and for all the school functions. The students who are slovenly dressed or not in uniform will be sent home.
8. All the boys (except Sikhs) must keep their hair short. The girls must tie their hair neatly with a green band.
9. The non-sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals. The sikh boys must wear turbans in class IX and above. A patka may be worn only while playing games.
10. Care must be taken of all the school property. No student should damage any school furniture and write or draw anything on the walls. The damage done should be reported at once to the class teacher. Recovery of the damage will be made from the concerned students.
11. No books (other than text books or library books), magazines or papers should be brought to the school.
12. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is prohibited.
13. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches, fountain-pens, items of jewellery) to the school.
14. The students, who come to the school escorted, should never leave before the escort arrives. In case of delay, they should report to the school office.
15. The school reserves the right to suspend the students whose progress in the studies is unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to the other students.
16. The parents and guardians of all the students should contact the teachers on PTA days to note the progress of their wards.
17. The parents and guardians must not visit their wards or teachers without the prior permission of the Principal.
18. The students should get their report Cards signed by their parents/guardians within two days of the receipt of the report cards.

1. The name, class and section of the pupil should be clearly marked on all the belongings of the students. Water bottles, blazers and jerseys should also bear the name of the student.
2. The school insists on observing the following measures by the staff members and all the students:
 - Care should be taken to observe the “green rules” in order to maintain clean and green surroundings. The school premises should not be littered with disposable tumblers, papers or polythene bags.
 - If polythene bags are brought to the school, care should be taken not to dispose them off in the school grounds.
 - Minimal use of polythene bags will be appreciated.
3. Do not pluck the flowers and don't damage the plants.
4. Delhi Public School students should invariably be polite wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged from their conduct. They should greet their teachers when they meet them. Bullying and using of foul language are punishable offences.
5. The students are not allowed to bring any sharp instruments such as knives or any kind of objects that can cause injury to the others at school.
6. The students are advised to keep their class rooms, school buildings and campus as clean as possible and throw leftovers into the dustbins.
7. DPS provides education from Nursery to class XII. Therefore, it is expected that the juniors are treated with love and affection while the seniors are respected. It means, there should be a perfect harmony between the juniors and the seniors.
8. No students shall indulge in any of the following practices:
 - a) Writing on the uniform
 - b) Spitting in or near the school building
 - c) Smoking
 - d) Any form of gambling
 - e) Usage of drugs or intoxicants
 - f) Rowdyism and rude behaviour
 - g) Violence or aggression in any form
 - h) Casteism or untouchability in any form
 - i) Bursting crackers or throwing colour on one another or painting faces within the school premises
 - j) Bringing a mobile phone to school under any circumstances.
9. A permission card, signed by the teacher (in charge of a period), must be carried by a child going to the clinic for the treatment.
10. A vaccination record must be produced at the start of the year, if the child is not completely immunized.
11. The students should not indulge in violent or destructive activities.
12. The students will not overlook the orders, directions and instructions given to them by the school authorities.
13. The students, using unfair means during examinations, will face disciplinary action as decided by the school authorities.

14. A child, failing twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school.
15. The students failing in one subject will be given a chance for re-appearing in the subject, in lieu of his previous result in the terminal exams.
16. No student will indulge in or support any act of violence committed by the other students.
17. The students will not do anything to disturb the principles and norms of the school discipline.
18. The school rules can be changed without prior notice or reason.
19. No attendance would be given to a student during the period of suspension.
20. Latecomers, uniform defaulters and children not doing their homework regularly will be sent home.
21. Any student using unfair means during tests will be given zero in the subject and issued a warning letter. Repetition of the same will result in dismissal.
22. The students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the receptionist. They will not be called to answer phone calls during class hours.
23. The school appointments will wear their respective, badges daily.
24. The students, using the school bus, will maintain discipline in the bus. The bus facilities will be withdrawn, if discipline is not properly maintained.
25. A sick child should not be sent to school. In case of an emergency, when the school doctor instructs so, the parents will be requested to take the child back. But, under no circumstances will the child be allowed to leave the school without an authority letter from the parents.
26. The students are not allowed to go to a relative/friend's house from the school.
27. No birthday gifts, in any form, are allowed. The distribution of any gifts/sweets in the school is banned.
28. The school provides all the necessary equipment for sports activity during the games period. The students are not allowed to bring their own balls, bats etc to the school.

School's Hostel-‘COSMOS OF OUR OWN’

The invigorating environment of the hostel brings forth a wholesome experience for those who opt for it. Fully air-conditioned ambience, laden with world-class facilities like recreational evenings, nutritious food, unique ‘BUDDY’ system, outings, holidays, sports-facilities, well-equipped medical and health centre under the supervision of caring house-wardens makes the stay enjoyable. The support system, that comprises parlour, gymnasium, laundry, reading room, helpers like plumbers, electricians etc., ensures a comfortable stay. Workshops are organized for polishing the personalities of the students and special-coaching classes are held under the trained personnel. Life skills are also inculcated in the students so that they can face the challenges of the outer world without any doubt.

Hostel Rules and Regulations

1. The hostellers will follow the daily routine of the hostel and the school unless exempted on medical grounds or recommendation of the Hostel Warden.
2. No student will be allowed to enter the hostel during the school hours.
3. The hostellers will not be allowed to keep more than Rs. 250/- or any valuables in their possession.
4. The hostellers will not be allowed to keep and take medicines / tonics without the knowledge of the Hostel Warden / Medical Officer.
5. The electrical gadgets like heater, kettles, irons or any other such appliances will not be allowed in the hostel.
6. The cupboards will be arranged neatly. Surprise checks will be made by the Hostel Warden. Any extra items, other than those specified in the hostel kit, will be confiscated.
7. The results of school tests and examinations will be sent to the parents through the Hostel Wardens within 10 days after every exam along with the warden's report on the students' conduct.
8. Any hosteller falling sick, will report to the school clinic. The emergency cases will immediately be taken care of by the Hostel Warden.
9. Hostel Attendance Timings: 2:30 PM and 8:30 PM
10. The lights will be switched off at 11: 00 PM
11. Leave Rules
Every second and fourth weekend of the month is a "Going-out Weekend". In case it is a working Saturday, then the next weekend will be a going-out weekend. The students are allowed to visit local guardians through the system of gate passes issued to them by the Hostel Wardens. The authority letters will not be accepted. Local guardians or parents must pick their wards personally.
12. Entry after weekend outings will be before 7:00 PM on Sunday. No student will be allowed to enter the hostel after 7:00 PM They will go to their local guardians who will then drop them at the school the next day before the school begins.
13. a) All students must report on the given date after any vacation, failing which they will be fined Rs. 1000/- per day or their admission will be cancelled.
b) Any application for attending the social occasions like marriages, functions or any other eventuality during the school term will not be entertained.
c) A written permission for the above should be obtained well on time.
14. Visiting Hours

15. The visitors and the parents are not allowed to visit the hostel / dorms. They will meet their wards in the visitor's room only. Only those persons will be allowed to become the local guardians who are employed, have their own residences and live in a family environment. No student will be allowed to become a local guardian to a hostel student of DPS Amritsar. The parents are required to leave a telephone number and address with the warden in Amritsar for immediate contact in case of any emergency. If a student returns after any illness, he / she should bring a fitness certificate, get it signed by the school doctor and show it to the warden before rejoining the hostel.
16. Compulsory Study Hours
8:30 PM to 11:30 PM in respective rooms under supervision of floor wardens/ attendants / teachers. On the examination days, the study timings can be extended for study in the common hall on their respective floors. However all lights in the rooms must be switched off at 11:30 PM. All students must maintain silence during these hours.
17. The hostellers will remain on their respective floors after the night roll call for self study. The study hour supervision will be done on their respective floors by their respective floor wardens.

19. Birth Day Celebrations (on Student's Choice): At tea time in the dining hall between 4:00 PM. to 5:00PM
20. PE is compulsory for all hostellers unless they are exempted by the school clinic doctor. The schedule for the games, is fixed for the boys in the evening. The students will wear the track suits which have to be purchased from the uniform shop at the time of admission.
21. The parents and the local guardians can contact their wards over the school telephone numbers between 6:00 PM. to 8:30 PM. daily and also between 9:00 AM. to 11:00 AM. on holidays.
22. The students will be punished for vandalism on the walls, usage of foul language, unruly movement in the corridors or any other form of vandalism.

23. Serious offences like cheating in the examinations, stealing, physical violence or damaging school property will be dealt with severity and could mean suspension / expulsion from the hostel.
24. The students will not be allowed to keep the mobile phones. A fine of Rs. 5000/- will be imposed on defaulters and the mobile phone will be confiscated. If the offence is repeated, it will lead to expulsion from the hostel.

Outings Students, escorted by wardens, will be taken out for the sightseeing, movies and shopping once a month – generally on the 1st and 3rd weekend.

Transport Rules

1. All the students using the school bus are expected to be on the right side of the bus stop at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
2. The buses will not wait for the late comers.
3. The children should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
4. No student should come near the entry door of the bus until it has made a complete stop.
5. All students must occupy their seats immediately after boarding their buses.
6. The front door of the bus is the only authorized entrance and exit.
7. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stop only, unless otherwise directed by the teacher in charge of the bus. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters and is subject to change.
8. When the bus is in motion, the students should not move around in the bus or project any of their body parts outside the window.
9. Objects of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.
10. The students will be held responsible for any damage to the buses caused by their negligence or vandalism.
11. No student is allowed to eat in the bus.
12. Discarding of trash or food either inside or outside buses is not permitted.
13. Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Only courteous behaviour is expected all the time.
14. The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
15. The teacher in charge of the bus and the student bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal.
16. Under no circumstances will children be allowed to board another bus to fulfill social engagements.
17. No student will board the bus without the identity card.
18. The lists of the students with bus stops etc. will be available in each bus.

Note: - You can change the bus route only with the permission of the bus incharge and on payment of the fee of Rs 200/-

Absence

1. The students, joining the school after prolonged illness, should bring a medical certificate from their doctor along with. A copy of the same is to be submitted in the school clinic for follow up.
2. The parents should fill up the “Record for Non-Attendance” for each day the student is absent from the school stating the reason for the absence.
3. The students, who require medical attention during school hours, may be sent by the teacher to the school clinic with a slip/note in the almanac.
4. No one, remaining absent from the school the last day, will be admitted to the class without a letter from the parent, addressed to the class teacher, stating the reason for the absence.
5. A leave can be granted on special grounds.
6. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days renders the students liable to have his name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only on the payment of the fresh admission fee.
7. All the students are expected to attend school on the opening day after each of the vacations. Those absent without sanctioned leave will be fined at the rate of Rs.25/- per day. Those absent because of sickness must present a medical certificate before they may be admitted to the class.
8. Absence, for more than three days immediately after a vacation, renders the students liable to pay a fine of Rs.100/- per day. After six days, the name will be struck off the rolls.
9. It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of their attendance in the year to be eligible to sit for their final examination. The percentage, however, could be relaxed on medical grounds.
10. No child, who is medically unfit, will be allowed to take class tests and examinations.

i) **Periodic test (10 marks):**

The school should conduct three periodic written tests in the entire academic year and the average of the best two will be taken. The schools have the autonomy to make its own schedule. However, for the purpose of gradient learning, three tests may be held as one being the mid-term test and other the two being pre mid and post mid term with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would prepare students acquire confidence for appearing in the Board examination with 100% syllabus. The school will take the average of the best two tests for final marks submission.

ii) Notebook Submission (5 marks):

Notebook submission as a part of internal assessment is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing note for the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

iii) Subject Enrichment Activities (5 marks):

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

For Languages: Activities conducted for subject enrichment in languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills.

For Mathematics: The listed laboratory activities and projects as given in the prescribed publication of CBSE / NCERT may be followed.

For Science: The listed practical works / activities may be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

For Social science: Map and project work may be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values):

Discipline significantly impacts careers shaping and it helps build character. Sincerity, good behaviour and values develop strength and foster unity and co-operation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on Five-point scale (A to E). The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and a structure approach. For a holistic assessment, the teachers are expected to make it an effective tool.

Important guidelines for Board Examinees (X and XII)

1. Revise each and every problem of the subject concerned.
2. Prepare a time table for the studies.
3. Try understanding the concept than cramming
4. Use simple language and good presentation skills.
5. Make good use of the 15 minutes reading time before the examination starts.
6. Read the question paper thoroughly.
7. First, attempt those questions which you are hundred percent sure of, then attempt the rest.
8. Leave 2-3 lines after each answer.
9. Underline the headings and the value points.
10. Draw the diagrams with the pencil and label them appropriately.
11. Concentrate on your own work than getting distracted by the other students.
12. Leave gap for the questions you are not sure about. Attempt the next question first. Come to the problematic questions later.
13. Do not waste your time if you get stuck on a question.
14. Time management, during exams, is of utmost importance.
15. Keep 15 minutes for revision.
16. Enter the examination hall with only necessary things such as a geometry box with all the accessories, two or more pens and a cardboard. No written material should be carried.
17. Go to the washroom before entering the examination hall so that you can concentrate for a longer duration during examination.
18. Start 1½ hour early from your residence for the examination centre on the first day so that you become familiar with the area and the distance.

Admission & Re-admission Criteria for Allocation of stream for class XI

The new session for class XI (2017-2018) will start from 12th April 2017 (Special classes). Admissions will be given on provisional basis. Final admissions will be done after board results.
